



Dr Malcolm Walker qualified in Medicine (MD) from the University of Birmingham in 1984 and completed clinical training in cardiology in London and Oxford before being appointed as Consultant Cardiologist and Physician at University College Hospital London (UCLH) in 1987. He has maintained cardiology practices at UCLH, the Middlesex and the Heart Hospitals, encompassing all aspects of adult cardiology and intervention, with periods as Clinical Director and Clinical Lead for Cardiology Services. He is also a cofounder of the Hatter Cardiovascular Institute.

Dr Walker also the first dedicated cardiology clinic for patients with disorders of haemoglobin. He has contributed chapters on cardiac management of thalassaemia for the UK National Standards Framework and the International Guideline published by TIF. He was an expert contributor to the AHA consensus statement on the management of cardiovascular complications of thalassaemia (2013).

In recent years Dr Walker has moved his focus from clinical practice to research at UCLH, particularly the cardiovascular complications of thalassaemia and the application of novel cardiac MRI sequences. In 2016 he helped establish the Cardio-oncology service at UCLH. Dr Walker has published over 100 articles in major scientific journals & have a Scopus H-index of 36.
