



Dr Nandini Sadasivam is a Haemoglobinopathy and general haematology consultant at Manchester Royal Infirmary. She has managed many complex transfusion dependent thalassemias and has consultant level experience in making decisions about combination chelation treatment in complex cases and managing acute emergencies including heart failures. She is also part of the BCSH writing group on Guidelines on the Diagnosis and management of iron overload in patients with haemoglobinopathies and rare anaemias. She is the clinical lead for Antenatal and Newborn screening programme for Sickle cell and Thalassemia in Manchester, and a member of the interim steering

committee for the National Haemoglobinopathy Registry. She is also the clinical lead for adult genomics medicine services for red cells in the North West. She actively participates in non-malignant research and has set up the pyruvate kinase deficiency trial in Manchester. She has also been actively involved and organised red cell teaching locally, regionally and participated nationally for the North of England.
