



Rachel Tattersall is an Adolescent Rheumatologist and clinical lead for the integrated Sheffield MSK service. She works at both Sheffield Children's Hospital and Sheffield Teaching Hospitals. With rheumatology teams at both hospital trusts she runs a seamless service for 10-25 year old patients designed to make the transition from children's' to adult services as smooth as possible, to provide tailored and developmentally appropriate care to young people in the service giving them as many choices about their care as possible and to support their families. She qualified in Medicine in 1995 and trained in adult rheumatology in Yorkshire and in paediatric rheumatology in Nottingham taking up her consultant post in Sheffield in 2008. She is chair of BANNAR, the Barbara Ansell National Network for Adolescent Rheumatology and co-chair of HASC (Haemophagocytosis Across Speciality Collaboration). Her research interests are in autoinflammatory disease and HLH, medicines decision-making and patient agendas in health care. Her interests outside work revolve around her 3 adolescent children.
